VII International Scientific and Practical Online Conference “Imperatives of Economic Growth in the Context of Achieving the Global Sustainable Development Goals”

We invite you to participate in the 7th International Scientific and Practical Online Conference “**Imperatives of Economic Growth in the Context of Achieving the Global Sustainable Development Goals**”, which will take place **on April 30, 2026**, at the Kyiv National University of Technologies and Design.

The conference will feature a presentation on the progress of the ERASMUS+ grant project “**Promoting of European skills and approaches for sustainable bioeconomy in the conditions of Ukrainian acute challenges**” (PESAB), which is being implemented from 2023 to 2026 at the Kyiv National University of Technologies and Design. **The Jean Monnet Module “Promoting of European skills and approaches for sustainable bioeconomy in the conditions of Ukrainian acute challenges” (PESAB)** builds on the successful implementation of international research and educational grants and projects at Kyiv National University of Technologies and Design, as well as additional skills, knowledge, and competencies in sustainable bioeconomy. **The main goal of PESAB** is to promote knowledge about the EU for the development of a sustainable bioeconomy in Ukraine in line with the EU’s bioeconomy strategy. The project is based on the creation of a module that provides bachelor’s and master’s degree students with additional skills in sustainable bioeconomy. The module offers three courses: “Biomass Use in the EU and Ukraine”; “Bioeconomy and Trade in the Context of International Relations between Ukraine and the EU”; “The European Union’s Sustainable Bioeconomy Strategy.”

The conference will bring together researchers, faculty members, industry experts, PhD students, and doctoral candidates from higher education institutions, as well as representatives of the business community from Ukraine and foreign countries.

FORMATTING REQUIREMENTS FOR ABSTRACTS

Top left corner – **UDC** (Times New Roman, 14 pt, 1.15 line spacing). Upper right corner – **Last name, initials (bold), academic degree, academic title, place of employment, city, country** (Times New Roman, font size – 14 pt, line spacing 1.15). After one blank line, the title of the abstract in uppercase bold, centered (Times New Roman, 14 pt, 1.15 line spacing). After one blank line, **the text of the abstract** (Times New Roman, 14 pt, 1.15 line spacing). The references should follow the abstract text. **The total length of the abstract should be up to 3 full pages in Ukrainian or English.**

Text Formatting Requirements

Paper size: A4 – portrait (21 × 29.7 cm). **Page margins:** left – 2.5 cm; right – 1.5 cm; top – 2.0 cm; bottom – 2.0 cm. **Font for abstract** – Times New Roman; style – regular; font size – 14 pt; line spacing – 1.15 (justified). Paragraph indentation – 1.25.

Do not use spaces, tabs, or other formatting elements in the text. Do not set manual hyphenation, and do not use headers or footers. Insert a non-breaking space (Ctrl + Shift + Space) between the numerical value and its unit of measurement.

ATTENTION!

Abstract pages must be filled out completely.

Formula typesetting: MS Equation 3.0. The use of graphic objects, frames, and tables for typesetting formulas **is prohibited**. A **table header** (14-point font) **is required**.

Figures must be accompanied by captions centered below the figure (14-point font) (example in Fig. 1).

Color illustrations and background images are not permitted.

The reference list is headed by the subheading “**References**” (Times New Roman, font size 14 pt; font style: “**Bold**”, centered) and formatted in accordance with the requirements of DSTU 8302:2015 “Information and Documentation. Bibliographic References. General Requirements and Rules for Compilation,” and is provided at the end of the abstract. Each entry in the list must be referenced in the text within square brackets. Footnotes at the bottom of the page are not permitted.

We draw authors’ attention to the fact that it is prohibited to cite in the text or include in bibliographic lists any sources published in Russian in any country.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right not to include abstracts that do not comply with the requirements.
